

SAFETY ADVICE



CAUTION: The blade is sharp and can result in serious and deep cuts. Therefore, never reach into the blade!

Only use cutting tools that are in perfect condition with sharp, clean and undamaged MARTOR blades. Also make sure that the knife's operation is not impaired by the material to be cut or by dirt or particle deposits around the blade.

1. Replacement of spare parts: Replace any blades that become dull at the right time! Dispose of old blades in a proper fashion. They should not be placed in a waste paper bin, as this poses a considerable danger of injuries.

- **2. Non-use of the knife:** Always secure the blade in such a way (depending on product type) that injuries due to cuts are excluded. Store the knife in a secure place.
- **3. Care instructions:** To guarantee a long service life, always keep the knife clean and do not expose it to unnecessary soiling and humidity.
